"KEEPIN' IT COOL CATS"

Cool Cats is a way to provided students with opportunities to take on responsibilities that are often the purview of adults. Having student playground monitors is not groundbreaking, but the approach was significantly different. Cool Cats has empowered students to become role models and playground coaches, but it also enabled them to grow in their own conflict resolution skills. So, with this model in mind, Mrs. Shinoda and I will continue the Cool Cats project. It will be a commitment (one day per week, all year long) and we would meet as a group once every few weeks to share experiences and build our skills together.

Students are already asking about Cool Cats and when they will start! Very soon we will release our "Cool Cats" on the playground. I am excited to learn from Mrs. Shinoda and all the Cool Cats!

I know it will be fantastic to see the Cool Cats encourage our youngest members to play together, take turns, follow rules and have fun.

This program has proven that MVB students come away feeling good about how they were able to assistespecially those K Kiddos who are still learning how to fit into the games that were being played.

What happens when a child becomes ill at school?

We will follow our past practice of moving the child to the "sick room" in the office, and call home to have someone come and pick up the child.

Children who become ill at school will NOT be able to ride the bus home.

Both adults and children should not attend school until they are symptom free. Staff who become ill will immediately need to go home, and will follow the same procedure. *We also know that some students may have different "baselines" – so, if your child has always had a "chronic cough" during the winter months, we wouldn't expect to treat it as if it were a Cold. We need to trust each other to react appropriately to these signs. The last few years has taught us about the importance of community! The awareness of only attending school when we are healthy protects our community.

Wild Cat Nation is thankful that our families and staff remain consistent staying home when sick.

<u>Family Communication:</u> We know that meaningful and ongoing communication between home and school has a positive impact on student learning and engagement. This year, <u>in-person Student/Teacher/Family Conferences will take place on Thursday, October 17th, 2024.</u> Students will not be in attendance this day, except during their scheduled conference time.

The Student/Teacher/Family conferences serve as an informal learning update and are an opportunity to share student strengths, areas of growth, and ways to support learning, particularly in the areas of literacy, numeracy, and social emotional learning.

This annual reminder is really important as it has to do with student safety. When dropping off your child in the Kiss and Go Lane, please only take a minute to say your goodbyes, to help us avoid the congestion during pick up and drop off.

Any volunteers in schools (coaches, drivers, etc.) are required to have a Criminal Record Check completed before they are allowed to volunteer with your school.

As of the 2024-25 school year, Police Information Checks will no longer be accepted
There is no charge for Volunteer CRCs through the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP).

Volunteer Drivers

A reminder that both staff and parents are required to follow the new district policy prior to being able to transport our students. The following documents

are needed to help out as a volunteer driver: •A copy of a valid Driver's Licence •A copy of you Driver's Abstract •A copy of the Vehicle Registration •A copy of the vehicle's Insurance
