There is no charge for Volunteer CRCs through the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP).

The following documents are needed to help out as a volunteer driver: •A copy of a valid Driver's Licence •A copy of you Driver's Abstract •A copy of the Vehicle Registration •A copy of the vehicle's Insurance
