FEEDING FUTURES



Feeding Futures funding is provided to all school districts to support students who need it most by delivering school food programs in ways that reduce stigma. Students may experience hunger at school for many reasons, including forgetting to pack their lunch, not having time for breakfast one day, or not having enough food at home. Each school district has the flexibility to develop programs to meet the needs of their local communities. This means that school food programs might look different across schools and districts.

The following are the free programs available at MV Beattie:



Breakfast Club:



Breakfast club runs every day from 7:50 am-8:05 am from our school kitchen. We serve a variety of foods such as eggs, toast, fruit and smoothies.



Souper Meals:



Souper Meals is a free, hot lunch experience on Mondays and Thursdays where all students are invited to share in a meal made from scratch from locally grown ingredients! Meals are provided by Shuswap Food Action Society and are served with a bun and raw fruit and/or veggies. Vegetarian and gluten-free options available by request.



Lunch top-ups



Youth appetites can be unpredictable! If your child did not bring enough lunch, we have extra food available every day. These are items such as sandwiches, cheese, fruit or granola bars.



*If your child has a serious food allergy, please inform the school.

HOW TO PLAY GAGA BALL

START THE GAME:

- Everyone stands inside the Gaga pit.
- One player throws the ball in the center.
- Players yell "Ga-ga-ball!" and the ball must bounce **three times** before play begins.

Hit the Ball:

- Use an **open hand** to hit the ball (no throwing or grabbing).
- You can only hit the ball once at a time (no double hits unless it touches a wall or another player first).

Avoid Getting Out:

You're **out** if

- The ball hits you **below the knees** (even if it bounces first).
- You hit the ball **out of the pit**.
- You fall down or touch the ground with anything other than your feet.

When You're Out:


- Leave the pit quickly and cheer from the sidelines.
- Some games let you re-enter when the person who got you out is eliminated.

Winning:

The last player left in the pit wins!

🍀 Distracted Caregiving/Parenting: Small Shifts, Big Impact

Life is busy. Screens, tasks, and notifications pull us in every direction. But even small moments of presence with your child can make a big difference.

What Is Distracted or Technoference?

Being physically present but mentally elsewhere—scrolling, replying, or just overwhelmed.

Why It Matters

Kids feel most secure when we're tuned in. Even short bursts of attention build trust and connection.

▼ Try These Simple Shifts:



- Put phones away during meals & bedtime

 - Talk about being more present
- Be kind to yourself—progress, not perfection

You're doing great. Every effort counts. Your presence matters more than perfection.

What happens when a child becomes ill at school?

We will follow our past practice of moving the child to the "sick room" in the office, and call home to have someone come and pick up the child.

Children who become ill at school will NOT be able to ride the bus home.

Both adults and children should not attend school until they are symptom free. Staff who become ill will immediately need to go home, and will follow the same procedure. *We also know that some students may have different "baselines" – so, if your child has always had a "chronic cough" during the winter months, we wouldn't expect to treat it as if it were a Cold. We need to trust each other to react appropriately to these signs. The last few years has taught us about the importance of community! The awareness of only attending school when we are healthy protects our community.

Wild Cat Nation is thankful that our families and staff remain consistent staying home when sick.

"KEEPIN' IT COOL CATS"

Cool Cats is a way to provided students with opportunities to take on responsibilities that are often the purview of adults. Having student playground monitors is not groundbreaking, but the approach was significantly different. Cool Cats has empowered students to become role models and playground coaches, but it also enabled them to grow in their own conflict resolution skills. So, with this model in mind, Mrs. Shinoda and I will continue the Cool Cats project. It will be a commitment (one day per week, all year long) and we would meet as a group once every few weeks to share experiences and build our skills together.

WILDCAT KISS AND GO DROP

Kiss and Go Lane

This annual reminder is really important as it has to do with student safety. When dropping off your child in the Kiss and Go Lane, please only take a minute to say your goodbyes, to help us avoid the congestion during pick up and drop off.

Also, there are typically cones/sign to remind you of where this zone starts. When people park for longer periods, and encroach the crosswalk areas, it creates poor sightlines

which means that drivers may not be able to see some of our little ones crossing.

Each year we have "near misses" - and they are all avoidable...when we follow the rules. Thanks!



Our neighbours also request that parents avoid parking in, or in front of, their driveways.

There is no charge for Volunteer CRCs through the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP).
