

School Volunteers – Criminal Record Checks (CRCs)

Any volunteers in schools (coaches, drivers, etc.) are required to have a Criminal Record Check completed before they are allowed to volunteer with your school.

As of the 2024-25 school year, Police Information Checks will no longer be accepted
There is no charge for Volunteer CRCs through the Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP).

Volunteer Drivers

A reminder that both staff and parents are required to follow the new district policy prior to being able to transport our students. The following documents are needed to help out as a volunteer driver: •A copy of a valid Driver's Licence •A copy of you Driver's Abstract •A copy of the Vehicle Registration •A copy of the vehicle's Insurance
